



On July 30, 2020 Northern Baptist Theological Seminary, (Northern) applied to the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund-FIPSE”, CFDA 84.425N.

On September 1, 2020, Northern Baptist Theological Seminary (Northern Seminary) signed and returned the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund-FIPSE agreement. In signing the agreement, Northern will use the funding received to provide tuition relief to new and current students.

The estimated number of students eligible to receive Emergency Financial Relief Fund under the CFDA 84.425 of the Fund was 294 students.

Northern received a total of \$439,000. As of December 31, 2020, \$58,094.68 has been distributed to 43 students under Section 18004 (a)(3). A portion of the grant under Section 18004(a)(3) may be allocated to the institution.

Criteria for determination with which students received the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund-FIPSE (named at Northern, “Northern Unity Grant”) Below is the information sent to eligible students to participate in the “Northern Unity Grant” under Section 484 of the Higher Education Act of 1965, as amended.

NORTHERN UNITY GRANT

This grant may be awarded to **current** students who would like to continue their education at Northern but are unable to enroll due to being on a financial hold or students of which are interested in continuing their education but are unable to pay due to personal financial stress. The grant may be awarded to **new** students who are currently enrolled and are under personal financial stress. The grant does not cover non-tuition fees or other expenses.

Criteria to be eligible:

New or current student must be currently enrolled or desires to be enrolled but is not eligible due to being on financial hold.

Student must complete the form stack application indicating the need and the reason.

New student grant

New student will receive a credit for the required deposit - \$250 for masters or \$500 for doctoral.

Plus the new student will receive a grant amounting to 3 credit tuition hours for master's level courses or 4 credit tuition hours for doctoral level courses.

Northern will give you information on how to set up a monthly payment plan.

Current student grant

Current student will receive a grant amounting to 3 credit tuition hours for master's level courses or 4 credit tuition hours for doctoral level courses.

If the current student is on financial hold, the student will be asked to commit to pay an amount agreed upon by both Northern and the student.
